RESOLUTION ADOPTING POLICIES FOR A DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY GOVERNMENT

WHEREAS, Montgomery County Government desires to maintain a work place environment for all employees that is safe and free of illegal drugs and in compliance with the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County Government recognizes that drug dependency is an illness and that it is recognized as a major health problem; and further, that drug abuse is a potential health, safety, and security problem; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County Government encourages any employee needing assistance as a result of dealing with drug dependency and/or drug abuse problems to contact the State of Tennessee Employee Assistance Program, a public or private regional treatment center, a personal physician, or one of the national drug assistance telephone numbers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners assembled in regular session on the 9th day of April, 2007, adopts the following policies to ensure a drug-free workplace, in keeping with the provisions of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988:

- 1. Montgomery County Government explicitly prohibits the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance while on premises or while conducting business. (Controlled substances, as defined in the United States Code Annotated, Vol. 21, Sec., 812, include such drugs as opium, opium derivatives, and hallucinogens, such as Marijuana, mescaline, pyote, LSD, psilocybin, cocaine, amphetamines, codeine, heroin, and morphine). The definition does not include lawfully prescribed drugs which are taken under a physicians care unless such prescription or prescriptions are being improperly used for an enhanced effect or are being used by someone other than the person for whom it was prescribed.
- 2. Any employee found to be in violation of the drug-free policy will be required to participate in a rehabilitation program and may be reprimanded, suspended or dismissed.
- 3. Employees must report any drug convictions resulting from violations occurring in the workplace or while conducting business. Employees must report such convictions to the Human Resources Department of Montgomery County Government within five (5) business days after the conviction. A conviction includes a finding of guilt, a plea of nolo contendere (no contest), or a sentence imposed by any state or federal judicial body. (This requirement is mandated by the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988).

- 4. Every employee will receive and sign a copy of the policy described above. By their signature, the employee acknowledges that as a condition of employment the employee will:
 - (a) abide by the terms of the policy; and
 - (b) notify Montgomery County of any criminal drug statute conviction for a violation occurring while in the office or while conducting Montgomery County Government business no later than five days after such a conviction.
- 5. Within thirty (30) days after receiving notice under item 4(b) above, Montgomery County will:
 - (a) proceed with the appropriate personnel action for the identified employee, commensurate to the violation, including dismissal, and/or
 - (b) require the employee to participate until satisfactorily released from a drug assistance or rehabilitation program that is approved or certified for such purposes by a Federal, State, or local health, law enforcement or other appropriate governing agency.
- 6. As required by the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988 under paragraph 13.1(d)(2), Montgomery County will notify the Economic Development Administration and the THDA within ten (10) days after receiving notice of such conviction from the employee or otherwise receiving annual notice of such conviction. Montgomery County Government, as the employer of a convicted employee must provide notice, including position title, to every grant officer or other designee on whose grant activity the convicted employee was working, unless the Federal agency has designated a central point for the recipient of such notices. Notice shall include the identification number(s) of each affected grant.
- 7. Employees needing assistance in dealing with these problems are encouraged to contact the Montgomery County Employee Assistance Program if available, one of the public or private regional treatment centers, their personal physician, or one of the national drug assistance telephone networks. Information on many of these will be available from the fiscal officer. Conscientious efforts to seek such help may not jeopardize any employee's job and the request for information related to seeking assistance will not be noted in their personnel record.

RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A DRIVER EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR YOUNG DRIVERS

WHEREAS, Montgomery County Government establishes a Driver Education Program to be offered through the Clarksville/Montgomery County School System to students; and

WHEREAS, motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for 15 – to 20-year-olds (based on 2003 figures, which are the latest mortality data currently available from the National Center for Health Statistics). In 2005, 3,467 15-to 20-year-old drivers were killed and an additional 281,000 were injured in motor vehicle crashes; and

WHEREAS, in 2005, 12.6 percent (7,460) of all the drivers involved in fatal crashes (59,104) were young drivers age 15 to 20 years old. Among 15- to 20-year-old drivers involved in fatal crashes in 2005, 30 percent (365) of those who did not have valid operator's licenses at the time of the crash also had previous license suspensions or revocations. For the same age group, 28 percent of the drivers who were killed in motor vehicle crashes during 2005 had been drinking. 23 percent of the drivers who were killed in crashes had a BAC of .08g/dL or higher; and

WHEREAS, according to the 2005 Census, the population in Montgomery County was at 147,474, with 32 percent of the population under 19 years old. The 2005 Census reflects a substantial increase in population from the 2000 Census population of 134,768. The high school student number in Montgomery County has increased from 7272 in January 2005 to 7969 in January 2007; and

WHEREAS, in 2004, motor vehicle crashes resulting in 43 fatalities in Montgomery County, reaching the highest yearly motor vehicle crash fatality count since 1981. Approximately one half of the total fatalities were under age 25 years old. In 2005, there were 25 fatalities and another 25 in 2006 as a result of motor vehicle crashes; and

WHEREAS, the population growth in Montgomery County and increased motor vehicle crashes involving young drivers has increased traffic citations, traffic crashes, and traffic fatalities, resulting in crowed court rooms, undue suffering and economic losses; and

WHEREAS, given the importance of making steady, incremental progress toward driver safety, it is encouraging that continued awareness of safe driving practices through a Driver

Education Program for young drivers will be a reminder of safe driving behaviors and teach the rules of the road. Therefore, reducing traffic citations, traffic crashes, and traffic fatalities will result in less time in the court room, less undue suffering and less economic losses.

WHEREAS, the County's Administrator of Court Safety is hereby authorized to develop a driver education program for young drivers for presentation to participants. Such program shall follow National Safety Council guidelines and course curriculum. "Alive at 25", Four-Hour, National Safety Council Course will be offered to students. Other National Safety Council Courses may be offered as deemed necessary; and

WHEREAS, a reasonable fee may be assessed for the driver education program; and

WHEREAS, driver education program allows successful participants to receive certification of completion; and

WHEREAS, driver education program may allow successful participants to receive premium discounts on vehicle insurance; and

WHEREAS, such driver education program teaches the rules of the road, safe driving techniques and is a reminder of safe driving.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners meeting in regular session on this 9th day April 2007, that by this resolution is hereby approved establishing a Driver Education Program for Young Drivers, to take effect May 1, 2007.

RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT OFFICE OF DOMESTIC PREPAREDNESS STATE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM 2006-GE-T6-0011, AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS

- 2. Nineteen hundred five dollars (\$1,905) for equipment and supplies for the Montgomery County Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) to continue training our citizens to prepare for and survive, and to assist others during and immediately following an emergency or disaster; and

WHEREAS, the grant period is from July 1, 2006 until April 30, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the funds are now needed to proceed with the awarding of the construction contracts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Montgomery County Board of County Commissioners assembled in Regular Session on this 9th day of April, 2007 that this Commission expresses its intent to fund the construction of West Creek Elementary School and that the sum of \$13,642,268.00 is hereby appropriated to the School Capital Project Fund, for the West Creek Elementary School construction project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this appropriation be funded by issuing Bond Anticipation Notes subsequently to be retired by the issuance of School Bonds, all pursuant to and in accordance with all pertinent provisions contained in Section 49-3-1001 through 49-3-1007 inclusive of Tennessee Code Annotated.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Schools shall file quarterly reports with the Board of Commissioners to include detailed expenditures by object code and a report indicating the progress of work. The progress report shall include the percent of work completed by major component and the amount paid to the contractor including retainage. Upon project completion or the expiration of the warranty, whichever comes first, a detailed closeout report by object code shall be provided within thirty (30) days to the Board of Commissioners.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Industrial Development Board (IDB) has previously determined that the need for a river port site offering an inter-modal facility to allow the transfer of products from river to truck, and if possible, rail mode of transportation is an important economic initiative for Montgomery County.

WHEREAS, The IDB is of the understanding that more than three plants located in the Clarksville-Montgomery County Corporate Business Park could use such a port facility in handling their bulk raw materials needed to produce their finished products.

WHEREAS, The IDB has completed the majority of the infrastructure to support the 880 acre expansion to the Corporate Business Park that is being marketed to attract new jobs for the region. It is the position of the IDB that having an Inter-Modal port site would be a benefit in marketing the efforts of the Clarksville-Montgomery County Corporate Business Park.

WHEREAS, The IDB has experienced, in its recruiting efforts, some feedback from Manufacturing prospects that reflects the freight cost in our region is not as competitive as some communities in the Southeast which IDB competes against for manufacturing projects. It has been explained that this cost can be favorably adjusted if such a port facility is developed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Industrial Development Board for the County of Montgomery, State of Tennessee, respectfully requests that the Montgomery County Commission activate the Montgomery County Port Authority by naming the members to said Authority, and to proceed forward to promote the development of a port facility on the Cumberland River.
